Sara's family walked for days to get to safety. They stopped every night and turned on the dented radio for just five minutes – so the batteries would last for as many nights as possible. Over the crackle of static, Sara and her children listened quietly and carefully. The news broadcasts told them where the fighting had spread and the safest route to the capital city.

Most journalists in South Sudan can't afford formal training. And the risk of spreading misinformation is high – a potentially deadly problem during a crisis.

During the most intense fighting earlier this year, media rumours about advancing militias drove people out of safe camps and into danger and exposure in the bush.
