Over the last year, AWAIC's generous community gave what they could to help survivors and their families get back on their feet. Every small gesture added up to make a BIG impact!

- 2,499 heroes made a financial gift to AWAIC!
- 56 fabulous friends held Facebook Fundraisers for AWAIC, raising \$14,368!
- 36 marvelous monthly donors sustained AWAIC's programs with a recurring donation!
- Generous grocery shoppers raised \$923 through Fred Meyer Rewards!
- 1,842 amazing Alaskans supported AWAIC through Pick.Click.Give., raising \$108,500!
- Last holiday season, 282 gift cards totaling \$7,474 were donated and distributed to families!

- Helped 94 individuals and families achieve safe, permanent housing
- Answered 6,493 calls to the 24-hour crisis and support line, providing survivors with critical information, referrals, and other resources
- Assisted 298 adults with protective orders, applying for pro bono legal services, and other legal matters
