We are trying to soak up every minute of this unique and special season in the Sonoran Desert and we hope you are too.

While I try to keep these emails focused on the joys of desert, it feels important to mention that we are again engaging directly with a threat to the Sonoran Desert, namely a proposed route for Interstate 11 through Avra Valley that would "thread the needle" between Saguaro National Park, Ironwood Forest National Monument, Tohono O'odham tribal lands, and other important protected open spaces. If you have time this weekend, please check out our updated I-11 webpage and consider submitting a comment on the recently released Final Environmental Impact Statement on this project, including a request to extend the public comment period from 30 days to 120 days.

Thank you so much for your love for the desert and your advocacy on its behalf. And keep your eye out for more on I-11 in the days ahead.







Claire Letourneaux shared this stunning photo of a full rainbow over the Santa Catalina Mountains, taken by one of her neighbors. Thank you Claire!
